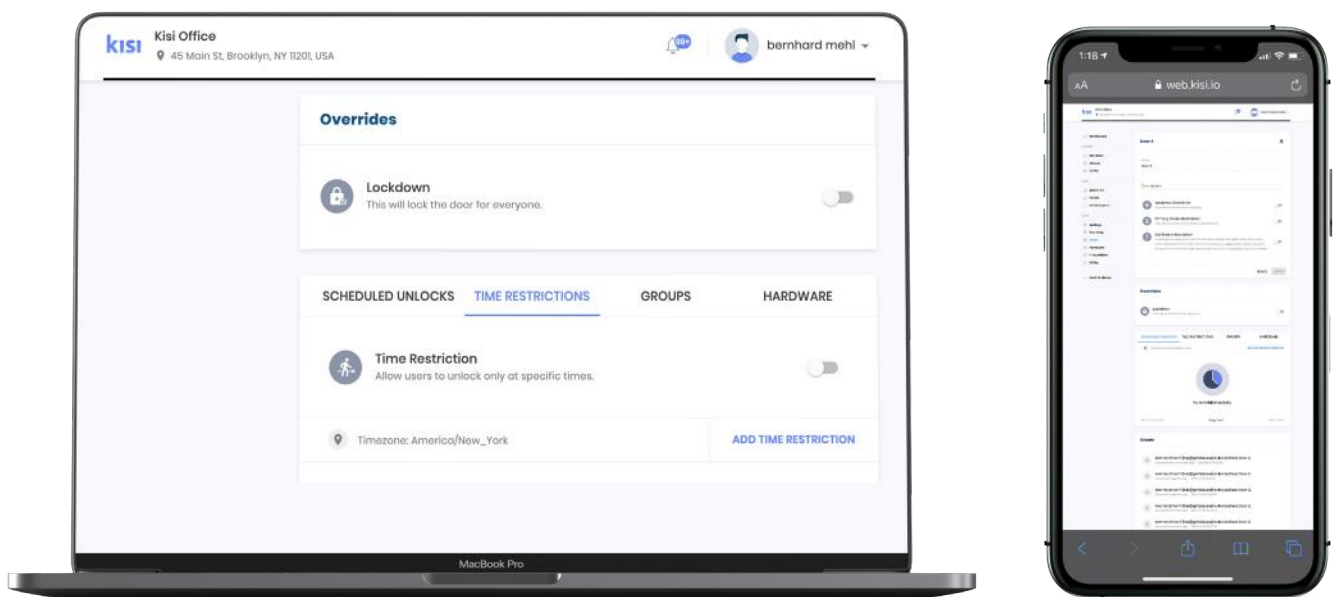




Lockdown Feature for Active Shooter or Emergency Situations

The number of shooting incidents at K-12 schools, according to the CHDS, reached an all-time high at 97 incidents in 2018—compared to 44 in 2017.

Kisi offers a lockdown feature for active shooter situations or emergencies, making it an effective protective layer for places that are targeted.



Forty-two states have laws requiring emergency or safety drills in schools and **nine out of ten public schools now drill students and teachers to respond to mass shootings**, according to the National Center for Education Statistics.

While active shooter drills may prepare students to react calmly during an emergency, they do not secure children or prevent an active shooter from accessing classrooms, gyms or other facilities.

Kisi's lockdown feature allows admins to override unlock attempts. All admins do is toggle the button to enable lockdown. Once enabled, no unlock actions can take place. To end the lockdown an admin simply toggles the lockdown button again.

Please note that the lockdown feature does not lock from the inside (therefore students and staff can still exit freely and in compliance with fire laws), but rather this feature prevents external people from entering while the lockdown feature is enabled.
